- 6. **New business: Gypsy moths**. Joselyn Morley reported that there is a document about the gypsy moth going on the GBCLA web site. She reported that individuals can remove the egg sacs from now until April. The Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry will not introduce any controls. They maintain that the population collapses after epidemic

years. There is a cycle, but drought causes problems. She reviewed the advantages and disadvantages of spraying with Bt. The Association is looking into the possibility of spraying but there are some challenges.

In response to a question about the role of the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry predicting the infestation, Larry Arpaia replied that it is difficult to predict. We need 5 consecutive days of -20C temperature this winter. The second issue is the droughts. We have had droughts for parts of 3 of the last 4 years.

It was pointed out that the public dock at Crow Lake needs attention.

ACTION: Jean Faucher will contact the Township and raise the issue of safety of access for emergency services.

It was requested that we send a thank you letter to the township for the road repair they have done. It has been excellent this year.

Trish Chartrand reported that as of August 4^{th} at 3:00 p.m. Tay Valley Township will commence with the replacement of the Bollingbroke bridge. It is to be complete by mid-November.
